

## Macintosh OS9 with AirPort Card

Go to the **Apple Icon** in the Top left corner of your Desktop screen. Scroll down to "**Control Panels**", then to "**TCP/IP**" and select.

Go to "Connect Via:" and select "AirPort"

Go to "Configure" and select "Using DHCP Server".

Close the window and select "Save".

Select "**Apple**"(Top left-hand corner). Select "**System Preferences**". Select "**Network**".



Verify "**Automatic**" is selected, (beside "locations"). Verify "**AirPort**" is selected, (beside "Configure" or "Show", depending upon OSX revision).
